

Undergraduate Program

Interior Architecture is a multilateral specialized profession that addresses the interior space design of the built environment. The Department of Interior Architecture aims to train young candidates, fully equipped with the knowledge, to contribute to the creation of a better environment for human beings. In the changing and developing design world, the responsibilities of interior architects cover a wide range of duties, including spatial analysis; design decisions; material selection and detailing; modeling; presentation, and application issues. Interior architects also deal with color, texture, natural and artificial light, sound, heating and cooling, furniture, and the like.

Teching and Learning

Our undergraduate programs, the studio, and theoretic courses are all formed to educate well-equipped interior architects. All the academic staff of the Faculty works in collaboration to achieve unity and quality in the educational activities. This diversity leads to a flexible program that allows students to choose among a wide range of elective courses related to their own fields of interest. Besides the formal education, numerous artistic, academic, and social activities are also organized in the Department. These activities allow students to experience their profession from a wider perspective. The visual and verbal presentation-based evaluation system in the studio courses which are the core of the program, aims at enhancing the self-confidence of the students as well as their presentation skills. Emphasis on teamwork is another important characteristic of the program worth mentioning.

About the Degree Program

The foundation's first year is common in our Faculty. After this first year, students engage in the specialized program of their departments. Interior Design Studio courses are the backbone of the program. In these studios, students gradually learn to solve the problems they may face as professional interior architects by designing interior spaces with various functions and in different contexts. The theoretical courses are planned to support this process. The wide range of our Presentation Techniques and Computer Aided Design courses empowers our students to present their design ideas in the best way. Elective courses are the other very important components of the program which allows students to specialize in different areas.

Design

Project Brief

This course emphasizes the design process through exercises on three-dimensional forms, space, function, material, structure, context, human dimension, and scale. Students will transition from abstract problems to concrete design challenges, focusing on the relationship between architectural form and space, natural light and light control, building materials, and circulation. The course aims to develop an awareness of these concepts within real-case scenarios, addressing human dimensions and scale, site context, topography, access, land utilization, climate, and landscaping. Emphasis is placed on integrating basic design principles with three-dimensional organization and enhancing graphic communication skills. Students will move from transitional projects to more concrete architectural design exercises, preparing scenarios to describe activities leading to architectural programming. The course also aims to familiarize students with the basic issues of design through a small-scale introductory project, promoting skills in problem-solving, model making, visual communication, and collaboration.




Project Brief

Project Brief

The FARC 101 Basic Design Studio course introduces students to the fundamental principles of design through a series of two- and three-dimensional exercises. Emphasizing creativity and critical thinking, the course aims to develop students' mental and manual skills by exploring design elements and their characteristics. The students will engage in various assignments that teach the basics of geometry, proportions, and the visual vocabulary necessary for architectural design. Through practical studio work supported by lectures and critiques, students will learn to address simple design problems, enhance their collaborative skills, and understand the relationship between form and function. The projects include creating collages, 3D models, and freehand drawings, culminating in a final project that incorporates modular and recyclable materials. The course structure ensures active participation, continuous assessment, and the development of a professional design approach.

Project Brief

Mobility between geographies increases the depth and quality of cultural exchange between communities. Travel and cooperation bring people together across cultural divides and facilitate the trade of customs and ideas. New community members bring unique talents and skills that can improve overall services and bring additional opportunities to an area.

"Famagusta has an international population with diverse cultural backgrounds that brings richness to many facilities including the service sector of the city. Cultural backgrounds of the international population are sources for Famagusta to provide various craft types of their home culture including spatial/functional aspects.

Students are expected to select a handicraft type with its country; and search about the craft type and its culture by defining its diverse cultural dimensions. Afterward, you are required to define a user profile for the "handicraft shop". A craftsman and an apprentice (who will be working during the summer period) can be accepted as the basic user profile. The craftsman moved to Famagusta from the country that you have selected and opened a handicraft shop.







GROUND FLOOR PLAN 1/50

The goal of the INAR391 course, "Co-Living, Co-Creation," is to design a shared living space for a diverse group of individuals who come together for specific reasons, such as retired people, single mothers, artists, university students, or wheelchair users. The project emphasizes the creation of a "home" that is both personal and functional, accommodating the unique needs and activities of its inhabitants. Students are required to develop detailed scenarios about the residents, their reasons for co-living, and their cultural and personal backgrounds. The design process involves researching spatial requirements, furniture, and special needs while considering ergonomics, safety, comfort, flexibility, and environmental responsibility. The final design should integrate private and communal areas, facilitating socialization and collaborative production activities.


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














INAR392 - 2023/24 SPRING SEMESTER INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE STUDIO IV

Project Brief

The goal of INAR492, Design Project for Interior Architecture Studio VI for the 2023–24 academic year, is to re-function an existing building as a "Healing and Well-Being Center" by designing its interior spaces to meet contemporary needs and conditions. 




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
