

Undergraduate Program

Interior Architecture is a multilateral specialized profession that adresses the interior space design of the built environment. Aim of the Department of Interior Architecture is to train the young candidates, fully equipped with knowledge, to contribute to the creation of a better environment for human beings. In changing and developing design world, responsibilities of interior architects cover a wide range of duties, including spatial analysis; design decisions; material selection and detailing; modelling; presentation and application issues. Interior architects also deal with colour, texture, natural and artificial light, sound, heating and cooling, furniture and the like.

Veching and Learning

Our undergraduate programs, the studio and theoretic courses are all formed to educate well-equipped interior architects. All the academic staff of the Faculty work in collaboration to achieve unity and quality and in the educational activities. This diversity leads to a flexible program which allows students to choose among a wide range of elective courses those related to their own fields of interest. Besides the formal education, numerous artistic, academic and social activities are also organized in the Department. These activities allow students to experience their profession in a wider perspective. The visual and verbal presentation based evaluation system in the studio courses which are the core of the program, aims at enhancing the self-confidence of the students as well as their presentation skills. Emphasis on teamwork is another important characteristic of the program worth to be mentioned.

Interior Design Studio courses are the backbone of the program. FARC 101 - 2022-23 FALL SEMESTER BASIC DESIGN STUDIO


Exhibition Design

#### **Project Brief**

As the last design problem of this semester thinking about the goals mentioned above you will choose one of the above SDGs (choose a goal that according to you reflects some major problems in your living environment such as violence, child labor, air pollution, water pollution, etc.). Make a short presentation to introduce your SDG (2-3 slides). Now you are going to design an exhibition space in your city to increase awareness about this issue through seminars, discussions and mainly the interactive exhibitions.

The Exhibition Center will be designed on a 6mx9m plot of land. You will decide about where in your city or town this exhibition can be allocated. Use Google map to find the suitable place. In your design this location will be very important because of the relation with the other buildings, pedestrian circulation and roads, etc. When you design you should consider all these factors. Allocate your 6mx9m plot on the site that you have chosen. Be very careful about the scale. From now on this will be your site to work on. You will use a short presentation (3-4 slides) to introduce your site. This presentation should include some information about your city, the reasons you chose this site, climate, sun direction, wind direction, etc

Scenario preparation to describe activities leading to architectural programming.






Cuttural Cafe

Tiny House Design


#### Project Brief

Emphasizing design as the major contributor to space / the life in the space is the main aim of this course. The course seeks to develop critical thinking at the base of achieving design abilities such as integrity and consistency by following a structured process. The studio provides the students with awareness of the complexity involved in design thinking. It allows students to explore design approaches as a unique experience, and resolve human- environment relationships not only with technical issues, proper scale and ergonomics, but also with social aspects. 

INAR 392 - 2022-23 SPRIING SEMESTER INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE STUDIO IV

Yournal Office

#### Project Brief

Your term project aims to bring an obsolete historical building, to be brought back to life as a journal office. The main objectives of INAR392 is to develop an understanding of cultural heritage and to apply appropriate reuse design approaches. The building is the Chimney House (Şömineli Ev) as a multi-layered historical building with traces from different historical periods. You are asked to make anadaptive reuse design for a certain part of this building as a journal office in the light of the given information. Post-pandemic period, along with daily life technologies, and new generation users, force life and traditional habits to change and transform. Transforming habits bring new attitudes, and these attitudes bring new behaviors. This change directly affects the user-object relationships or user-physical environment relationship. In the light of all these data and needs, you are expected to realize an original design.

INAR 491 - 2022-23 SPRING SEMESTER INTERIOR DESIGN STUDIO - IV Fashion Academy of Fashion Designer

The project focuses on design of space as a social, educational and cultural issue with more complex functional make. The project is about the combination of educational facilities with spaces for broader public use - leisure and entertainment activities. Within the given architectural space, it is expected to develop the design of an Educational Complex: a Fashion Academy of an fashion designer which will also have spaces that will partially open up to accommodate public and serve as a cultural and social meeting point within the city. Hence while the main part of the Fashion academy is to meet all the special-ized requirements as educational environment, some of the spaces should be considered in terms of fashion-based performances (mainly fashion shows) which would be open to public occasionally and allow the public access at the scale of the city.

Within the scope of Interior Architecture Studio, in the 2022-23 academic year Spring Semester, the given building (attached) was expected to be designed into the Departures Terminal of the Famagusta Port under today's conditions and needs of the transportation sector. The Departures Terminal design was composed of a Lounge, a Duty-Free, and a Short Term Stay Hotel (2-3 rooms) functions, as the main functional areas. Within the project's scope, the students were asked to develop a scenario in which the main functions can be specified and detailed within the given subject. The students were also expected to develop a distinctive spatial identity for the place to be designed and refer to this identity as an effective asset in creating the characters of all related spaces.
